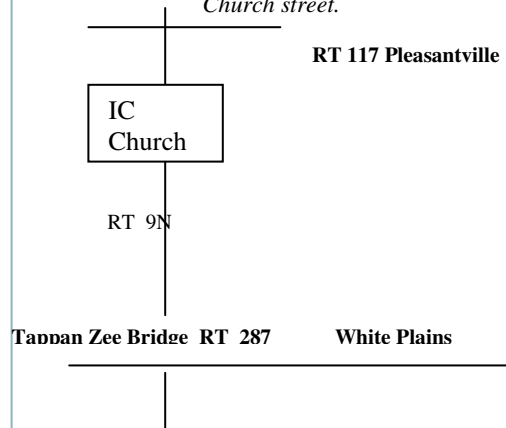

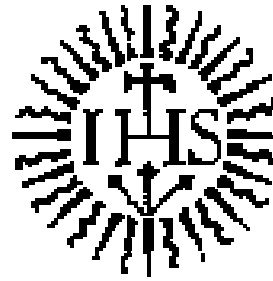

The Holy Name Of Jesus

**“His name was called Jesus, which
was called by the Angel before He
was conceived in the womb.”**

January 6th – The Epiphany of Our Lord

The word Epiphany means “manifestation.” The Church in the Mass commemorates a triple manifestation of Christ:

- to the Magi, that is to the Gentiles;
- in His Baptism, when the Voice from heaven declared:
“This is My Beloved Son”;
- and
- in the miracle of changing water into wine at Cana.
