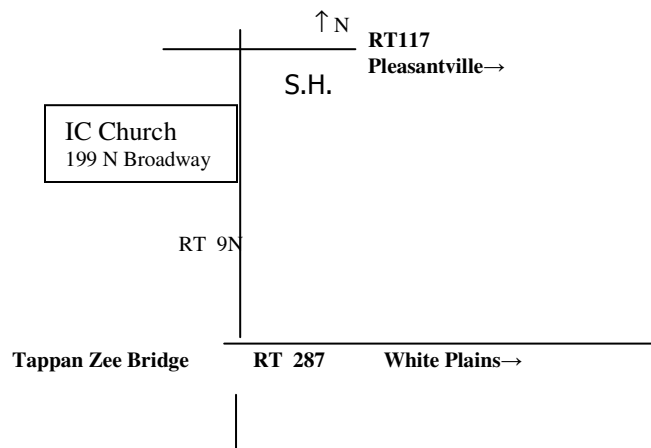

### WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN “HIGH MASS” AND “LOW MASS”?

Simply put, at *High Mass* the prayers and responses are sung whereas at *Low Mass* they are spoken. Among other obvious differences a High Mass includes the *Asperges* after the procession, the use of incense, and the lighting of six candles on the altar instead of two. A *Solemn High Mass* includes a leaon and subdeacon in addition to the priest (our “High Mass” with one priest is more properly called a *Missa Cantata*).

## May Devotions that Honor Our Blessed Mother

Throughout May, Catholics celebrate Our Lady. We remember her with prayers and hymns, with May procession and crowning. Many faithful use this month to renew their devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary, or to become acquainted for the first time with the graces and blessings that come from following her example.

### Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary May 31<sup>st</sup>

Once Mary bestows her sweet smile upon anyone, then there is no need to fear about the salvation of such a privileged soul. Mary loves her children and guards them with far more care and far more affection than any earthly mother could love her child.
